

# FUNDRAISING SUPPLEMENTS EDUCATION

While we realize tuition makes up the majority of our revenue, the school receives additional funds through fundraising and tuition assistance, which is used to educate our students. For the 2022-2023 school year the actual cost to educate one child was **\$5,800**; while our tuition rate for one Catholic student was **\$4,750**. If you consider the tuition that is paid for one student, you will see that each student received a discount of **\$1,050** due to fundraising and parish support.

Once again, we would like to thank all our families and community members who helped in any way with our fundraisers last year. Whether you chaired or attended an event, bought chances or tickets, donated time or money, we are grateful for your contribution.
