Our mission, as a Catholic Educational Community, is the religious and academic formation of students in preparation for their lives as productive Catholic adults.

School Overview

Seton Catholic School, located in Moline, Illinois, is a parochial institution serving students in preschool through eighth grade and is sponsored by the four Moline parishes: Sacred Heart, St. Mary's, St. Maria Goretti, and Christ the King. The school, originally Sacred Heart School, was consolidated with St. Mary's School in 1978 and became Seton Catholic School.

Facilities

Seton's campus is located in a middle-class residential neighborhood on the grounds of Sacred Heart Parish. Our campus consists of four buildings on one campus. The two-story elementary building houses the first through fifth grade classrooms, art room, music room, computer lab, and two special education reading resource classrooms. The middle school building, built in 1998, houses nine classrooms for grades six through eight. Also located in the middle school building are an art room, computer lab, two science labs, gymnasium, library, and a visual media lab. The Sacred Heart Parish Hall includes Seton's Early Childhood Center. It houses the prekindergarten program for four year olds, three kindergarten rooms, gymnasium, and cafeteria. Seton's preschool program for three year olds and the extended care program are located on the main floor of a building shared with the Sacred Heart Parish offices.
