For decades, Seton has **prepared students with solid foundations** in science and math. As the national focus on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) ramps up, Seton is **challenging its students** in these two new essential fields of 21st century education.

Technology is a part of students' lives almost from birth. Seton continues that immersion with computer class every week from kindergarten through eighth grade. Computers, iPads and SMART Boards are integrated into the curriculum, and students are encouraged to use technology in the computer lab, in the classroom and at home. Seton also offers online enrichment programs in math, reading and foreign languages. The after-school Lego League challenges middle school students to compete in robotics against other clubs.

Seton teaches students to be **good citizens of the digital world** and prepares them for using technology as a learning tool in high school, college and career. Through the essential STEM fields, students are **gaining experience** that will help them **make a difference** in the 21st century world.

# Accreditation

Private schools provide quality education. Seton Catholic School is fully accredited by AdvanceEd North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement. The State of Illinois has granted our school full recognition under the guidelines for Recognition of Non-public Elementary Schools.

**Presidential Academic Achievement Awards (GPA of 3.5 or higher) were earned by 76% of 2014 graduates.**

The life of the mind suffuses Seton's hallways and classrooms, as both students and teachers put academics first. During and after school, Seton students interact with teachers on an **individual basis**, allowing faculty to personalize lessons to various learning styles. Instilled through classroom lessons, computer programs and after-school activities, Seton's curriculum focuses on the foundational subjects of reading and math. This emphasis has led Seton students to regularly **score above the national average** on standardized tests. Another result of Seton's **solid curriculum** and diverse learning opportunities is the **success of alumni** who have gone on to careers in medicine, technology, business, science, education, law, media and the arts.

**Seton students measure up.** For the past eight years, Seton has consistently scored above the national average in all testing areas of the Iowa Tests of Basic Skills (ITBS). Seton's scores on the MetriTech Writing Quest Assessment, beginning in fourth grade, are continually improving—meeting or exceeding the benchmark scores over the past years. Finally, on the Assessment of Catechesis Religious Education (ACRE) measuring knowledge of Catholic doctrine, Seton has scored well above the national average in all domains.
