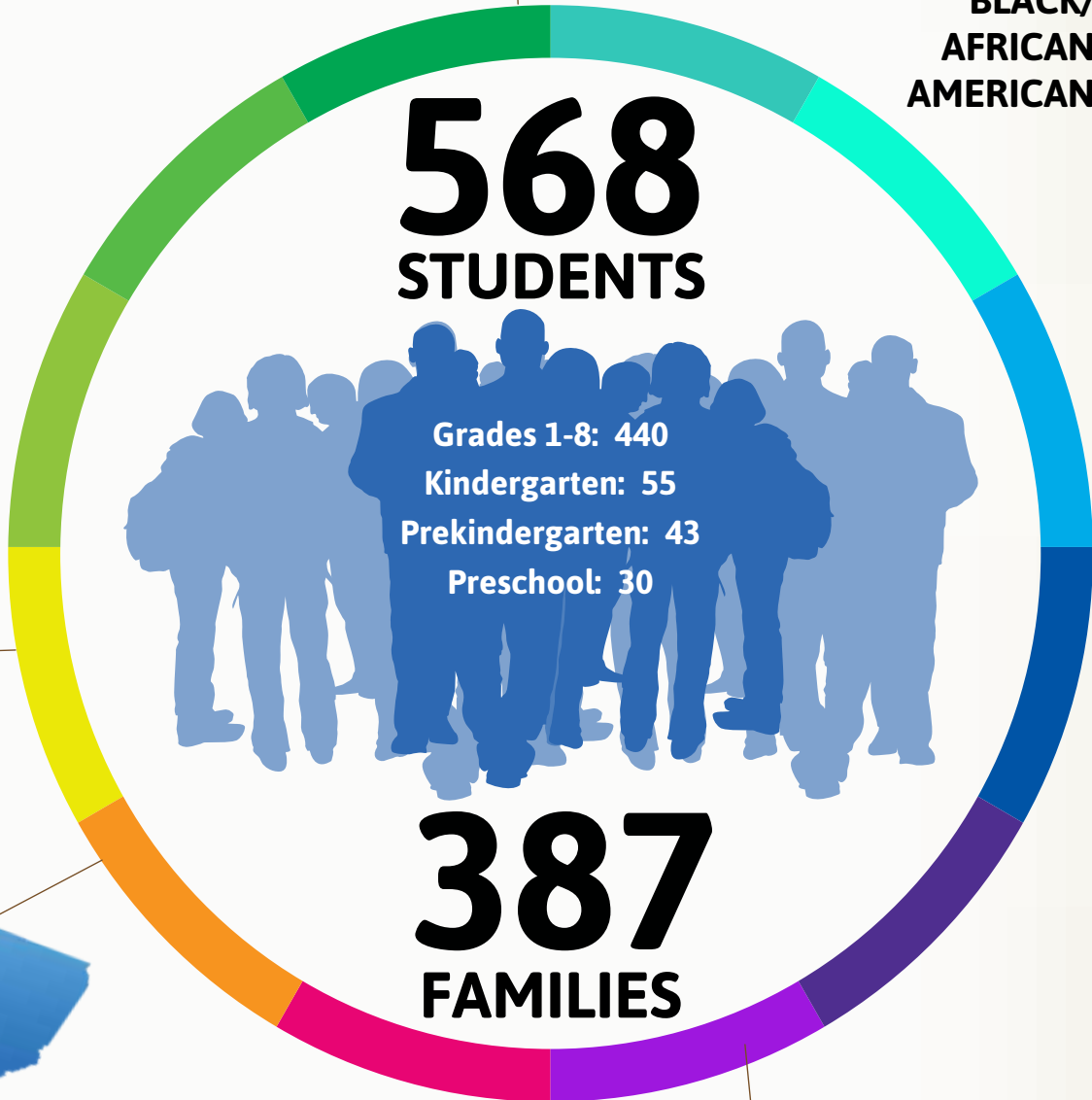

## STEM

### SCIENCE

Seton is in the process of reviewing and updating the science curriculum under the guidance of Dr. Robert Keller, chair of the Division of Mathematics, Engineering, and Computer Science at Loras College, in Dubuque, Iowa. Seton is focused on enhancing our curriculum in order to become a “Next Generation Science Program,” which teaches science as both a body of knowledge and an evidence-based model and theory-building enterprise. With three dimensions of practices, crosscutting concepts, and disciplinary core ideas, this curriculum is coming alive in our classroom and science labs.



### TECHNOLOGY

Seton continues to expand and integrate technology in all areas of the school and curriculum. We are a wireless campus with SmartBoards in all classrooms. Students get hands-on experience with iPads and with new Chromebooks that use Google Apps for Education. Research shows that effective tech integration across the curriculum deepens and enhances the learning process, and Seton is making that research a reality.



### ENGINEERING

At Seton, middle school students experiment with engineering concepts in the *Seton Lego League*. In the past, one team created a cellphone specifically for senior citizens that would teach them how to use modern technology. The other team created an app that shared fun and easy ways to remember basic facts for any school subject. The *Lego League* is facilitated by teachers and parents, giving the students a chance to engage in real-world engineering.



### MATH

Over the past two years, Seton has completed a comprehensive review of math curriculum with guidance from Dr. Trish Guinee, a mathematics consultant from Peoria, Illinois. Dr. Guinee has provided professional development, observed all our math classes, given feedback to our staff and met individually with all grade level teachers. The Seton math curriculum is aligned with the *New Illinois Learning Standards for Mathematics Incorporating the Common Core Learning Standards*.



## EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING AND ENRICHMENT

Seton is dedicated to **expanding experiential learning** for our students. In our science labs, students do hands-on experiments to expand their knowledge of the scientific world. Offering a variety of **field trips, knowledgeable speakers and interesting presentations**, Seton offers students a chance to take their education beyond the classroom.

Middle school students practice **video journalism** through Seton's News Network (SNN), writing, producing, recording and editing a newscast. Our students also practice journalism in the school newspaper, *The Charger*, which offers a chance to hone writing, design, and production skills.

Our **foreign language program** teaches Spanish and French and gives students an understanding about other countries and cultures.

The **visual arts program** at Seton exposes students to a variety of art forms, including drawing, painting, mixed media, sculpting, printmaking and as many age-appropriate mediums as possible. When students create art through images, sounds, gestures and words, they discover ways to share their thoughts and emotions with others.

Seton's **music arts program** introduces the basic building blocks of music, including rhythm, melody and harmony. Students learn the importance of musical collaboration through singing and instruments and have the opportunity to join their classmates in band and choir groups.





## ACADEMICS

The curriculum of Seton Catholic School is designed to **challenge and motivate** students to achieve academic success, while simultaneously building **self-confidence, self-discipline, and healthy work habits**. Seton’s curriculum focuses on the foundational subjects of reading and math. This emphasis has led Seton students to **consistently score above the national average** in all testing areas of the Iowa Tests of Basic Skills (ITBS). Students have **exceeded benchmarks** in the MetriTech Writing Quest Assessment over the past years. On the Assessment of Catechesis Religious Education (ACRE) measuring knowledge of Catholic doctrine, Seton has scored well above the national average in all domains.

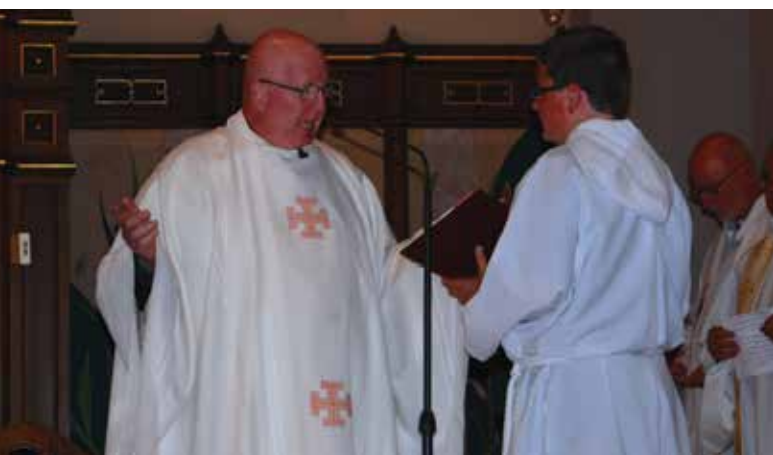

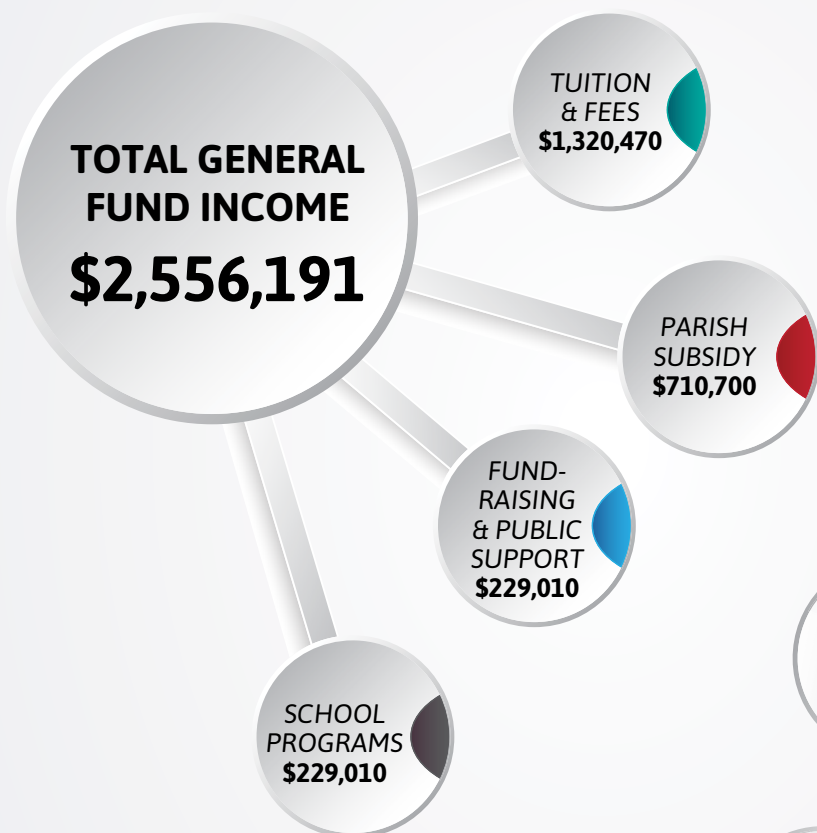

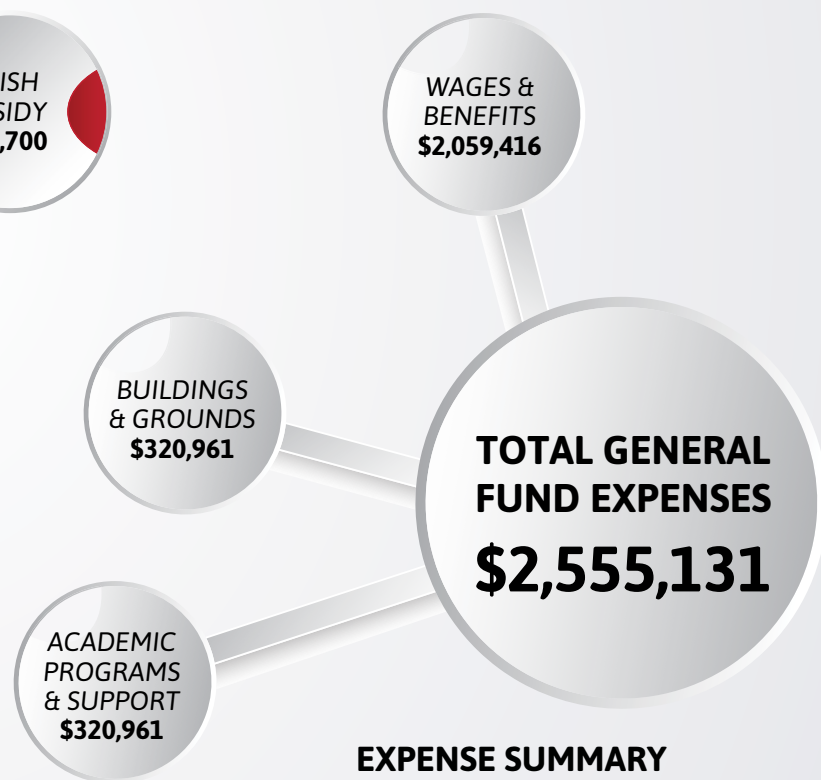
